President's Report

Well Ladies and Gentlemen, we achieved quite a lot in the McKay Gardens this year. Stage One of the Council redevelopment is now complete. The old bowling greens have been removed and reclaimed as part of the gardens. Garden beds created. planted and drip irrigation installed. Some of the large Date Palms originally located next to the bowling green have been relocated in a separate garden bed and the new lawn area has been seeded (although there isn't much to show for that yet). New heritage style seats have also been installed in the new area. Despite our lack of rain and the occasional plant theft, the new development is now

looking good. The rows of flowering Lambs Ear are particularly attractive. Well worth a look.

The second stage of the Council redevelopment is now in process and we hope to have commencement early in the new year. At this stage the proposal is for Stage two to replace the current path between the footbridge and Anderson Road, restore some of the internal path system and improve lighting. The Friends are also lobbying the Council to develop long-term plans for improving the watering and irrigation to the gardens: the current system outside the new development continues to be inadequate and unreliable. No joy on this

matter yet, but we will keep at them. If anyone has any great ideas in this regard we would love to hear from you.

The Friends also held a fund-raising stall this year. Alas to no great success. It was a bitterly cold day and it seems we chose the coldest site available. Even so, the experience was worthwhile – if just to gain experience in what not to do. Many thanks to Helen and Yvonne in particular for helping out. True stalwarts in a storm. And thanks to everyone who helped or donated material.


