Welcome to another fabulous edition of the Friends newsletter for Winter. In this quarter we formally requested Council to allocate money in its next budget to reinstate lights in the Gardens and to also to replant garden beds along the Straight Six removed in anticipation of the airport rail works that have not as yet happened. The ongoing discussions Friends are in descendants of HV McKay about their proposed kind donation of a mature Monkey Puzzle tree to plant in the Gardens, and to lay a memorial plague in commemoration of the Centenary of HV McKay's death that occurred on 21 May 1926.

As Friends Member, Neil Head notes, 'McKay was the industrialist/benefactor for the Gardens. He is also associated with so many of the foundation elements of Sunshine, including Albion new town, the Albion Soldier Settlement Estate, the Railway Pedestrian Overpass, the Sunshine Club, Former Sunshine Technical College and an almost endless list thereafter. Remnant parts of his work and donations can be seen all over Sunshine and Albion, many of them heritage-listed items.'
